

Part 3 – Eight Life Skills to Build within Your Child's Heart (1)

- I. LIFE SKILL # 1: HOW TO GET ALONG WITH OTHERS.
 - A. Proverbs 20:3 "It is an honor for a person to cease from strife; but every fool will be fighting."
 - B. Teach your children to prize and be loyal to your family.
 - 1. A whole lot of loyalty to parents happens when parents are <u>balanced</u> in discipline and affirmation and when those parents give their children the personal time they need throughout their lives.

Ephesians 6:4 "Don't keep on scolding and nagging your children, making them angry and resentful. Rather, bring them up with <u>loving</u> <u>discipline</u>...." (NLT)

- 2. Time with your child is the most important investment you can ever make.
- 3. Accept each child with the personality and abilities God gave them and parent each child individually without <u>comparisons</u>.
- 4. Your children will one day treat <u>you</u> like they see you treat and talk about their <u>grandparents</u>.

They will one day treat their extended family like they see <u>you</u> treat your extended family.

- C. Teach your children how to build great **friendships**.
 - 1. Learn to pick good friends.

Proverbs 27:19 "A mirror reflects a man's face. But what he is really like is shown by the friends he chooses."

a. Build friendships with people who sharpen you.

Proverbs 27:17 "Iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another."

- b. We become like those with whom we spend our time.
- 2. Learn to be a good friend.
 - a. A good friend cares for that friend when things are going well and when things are not.

Proverbs 17:17 "A friend loves at <u>all times</u>, and a brother is born for adversity."

- b. Real friendship shows itself in putting another's needs ahead of our own.
- c. A good friend treats the other person as an equal.
- d. Real friendship forgives.
- D. Teach your children how to heal a <u>broken</u> relationship; how to forgive and ask forgiveness.
- E. Teach your children how to respect authority.
 - 1. Adults in the home.

Ephesians 6:1-3 "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. ² "Honor your father and mother," which is the first commandment with promise: ³ "that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth."

- 2. **School** teachers and Bible Fellowship Teachers.
- 3. Police and civil authorities.

Romans 13:2 "Therefore whoever resists authority (civil authority) has opposed the ordinance of God; and they who have opposed will receive condemnation upon themselves." (NASB)

- 4. Church ministers and church volunteers.
- F. Teach your children the proper way to treat people in general.

Luke 6:31 "Do to others as you would have them do to you." (NIV)

1 Peter 2:17 "Show respect for all people [treat them honorably]." (AMP)

II. LIFE SKILL # 2: PROVIDE HEALTHY DISCIPLINE FOR YOUR CHILDREN.

A. The parent's job is to move their kids from <u>parent</u> control where you have to tell them everything they are to do, to eventually, <u>self</u> - control – where they know and do the right thing on their own; to ultimately, <u>God</u> control where they're yielding themselves daily to God who made them.

Kids want <u>rules</u>. <u>Healthy</u> rules, discipline and boundaries give kids a sense of <u>security</u>. Kids thrive in routine.

- B. If we don't discipline our kids it means two things:
 - 1. We are willing to participate in their destruction.

Proverbs 19:18 "Correct your children while there is still hope; do not let them destroy themselves."

- 2. We do not <u>love</u> our children, in the way we should. Proverbs 13:24 "If you refuse to discipline your son, it proves you don't love him."
- C. What is the right way to discipline?
 - 1. Discipline your children for a mistake of character.
 - 2. Don't correct in anger.

Ephesians 6:4 "Don't keep on scolding and nagging your children, making them angry and resentful. Rather, bring them up with the loving discipline, with suggestions and godly advice."

- 3. Avoid disciplining your children in public.
- 4. Watch your words.

Ephesians 4:29 "Don't use harmful words. Use only helpful words, the kind that built up."

5. Forgive immediately.

Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind and loving to each other, forgiving each other just as God forgave you in Christ."
