Luke 10:25-37

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I. IF WE ARE GOING TO BE A GOOD NEIGHBOR WHERE DO WE START?

A. *Galatians 6:10* “Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to **all** people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.” (NIV)

B. We can't care unless we're **aware**.

II. THERE ARE THREE **PHILOSOPHIES** OF LIFE THAT JESUS' STORY SHOWS US.

A. The robbers had the philosophy that “what is yours is mine so if I can, I will **take** it.”

B. The priest and Levite had the philosophy that what is mine is mine and I'm going to **keep** it so I am going to ignore your need.

We are never more like **Jesus** than when we are helping hurting people.

C. The Good Samaritan had a philosophy that what is mine is not really mine. I'm just a steward over it. It goes wherever **God** wants it to go so I will help you.”

The greatest doctrine of the Bible is **love** – loving God and loving others. No other doctrine in the Bible is ever intended by God to get in the way of us loving other people and treating them with kindness and compassion.
